

## OPEN EDUCATIONAL RESOURCE (OER) CHANNELS

There are lots of fantastic open collections of images, textbooks, and other resources where you can find a wide range of high-quality content for your course. Here are some useful websites worth bookmarking:

## Images, video and audio

<u>Media Hopper Create</u> is the University of Edinburgh's own media platform, where staff and students share media internally and publicly. Select 'Creative Commons' at the top of the page to see a large range of video content available for download and re-use. You can filter by channel too so you can browse by topic or course title.

<u>YouTube</u> has lots of great media by reputable academic institutions and organisations which can be embedded into your course. You can use YouTube videos in your course as long as you embed them using a direct link or the YouTube embed code. If the YouTube video has been released under Creative Commons licence, it's important that you include the appropriate attribution.
